<u>The Joint Commission</u> develops measurable standards for healthcare organizations as they relate to patient safety and quality of care. Joint Commission standards are available online, for review, and include:

- Sterile and non-sterile medication compounding

<u>The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)</u> creates regulations regarding the management and disposal of hazardous waste pharmaceuticals.
